## PIPS HOPE AND SUPPORT

Hi, My name is Jack Scappaticci, I am the Community Development and Training Officer at PIPS hope and support. We have teamed up with Hilltown Pharmacy for this Building the Community-Pharmacy Partnership Program (BCPP) and are looking for a group of between 10 - 15 young adults aged 12 – 17 from the Hilltown area. The BCPP aim to bring together the pharmacy and the community together to reduce health inequalities using an asset-based community development approach.

This would run for 16 weeks within a 12month period, usually 1 session per week. Each week would be a different and relevant topic chosen by the group. The group can be 10 – 15 participants and must be the same group throughout. Costs are covered and there are funds available for activities.
